SELONDA is among the top exporters in Europe competing for the Imports/Exports Award in the European Business Awards 2012/2013

Athens October 1, 2012 – Selonda earned the distinction of being selected as a “National Finalist” in this year’s European Business Awards, competing for an award in the exports category (imports/exports award).

The nomination comes as a result of our company’s solid focus on international activities and consistently strengthening exports, which has been the main axis of our company’s development strategy for decades.

Exports to over 20 countries accounted for 87% of total sales in 2012, which amounted to a total of 131.1 million euros. It is exactly this achievement that has placed Selonda among the export “champions” of Europe.

The strategy of expanding into new, developing markets also led to Selonda being recognized as a “leader in the Mediterranean aquaculture industry”, as characterized in a recent article in the Industrious Publication, an internationally acclaimed monthly review published in the UK.
